Today's Board Time was one more example where two citizen losses unfolded.

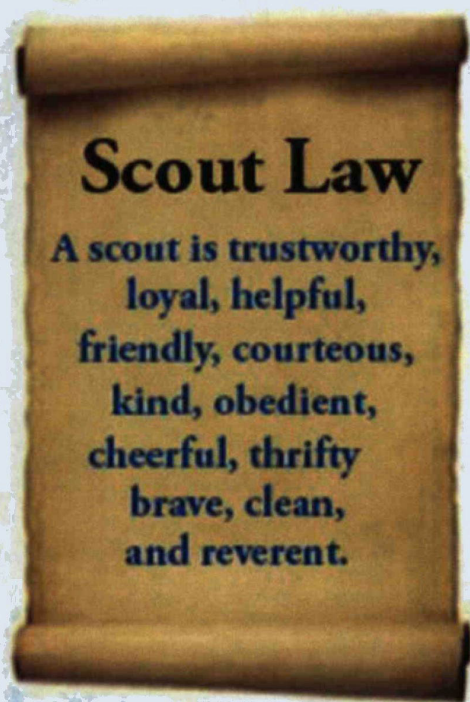

2 - You will witness the chaos and disorder of their continual rude interruptions that makes it nearly impossible to think and communicate. It is hard enough trying to stay focused to defend the citizens in such a disrespectful environment. It is even more difficult when the most fundamental rule of Roberts Rules of Order (don't interrupt) is shown such contempt.
